The past year has been one of growth and forward motion. We saw a steady increase of patrons visiting the Library once again and borrowing materials to near pre-pandemic levels. Program offerings increased over time and attendance followed suit. We also saw a marked increase in new library cardholders, presumably due to an influx of movement to the area or perhaps patrons who hadn't visited in many years, returning to their "home" library.
