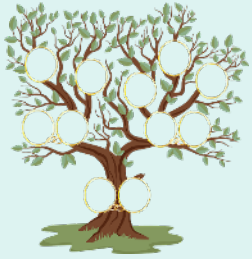

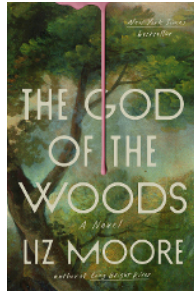

Author Visit with Liz Moore

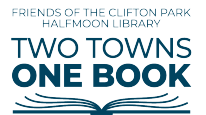

Sinister Spring: A Mystery Author Event featuring Terrie Farley Moran

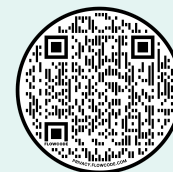
Saturday, April 11, 12-4 pm

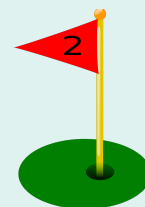

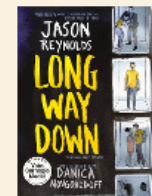

NEW! SEED LIBRARY

In this time of expectancy, some of you may be preparing to get your hands in the dirt, whether as a veteran gardener or a complete novice. Perhaps you already know that the Clifton Park-Halfmoon Public Library has an abundance of books and resources on all types of gardening, from landscaping, to flower gardens, to container gardens, to organic kitchen gardens. Now, thanks to Cornell Cooperative Extension (CCE) of Saratoga County, you'll also be able to find seeds at the Library.

Beginning around mid-March, there will be seeds and informational brochures available in a beautifully decorated display within our *Library of Things*, just around the corner from the Ask Desk. (You may already be familiar with this as the location of our board games, bicycle pump, hiking backpacks, binoculars, Blu-ray player, and more.) There will be a variety to choose from at no charge.
